There are different legal decision-making scenarios, including joint legal custody (joint legal decision-making), where both parents make the child's decisions together, or sole legal custody (sole legal decision-making), where one of the parents has the right to make those decisions alone. Parenting time and legal decision-making are two very important concepts in family law. Both are issues that will be decided in your family law matter, in the event of a divorce or paternity action.

What is Legal Decision-Making? - Rose Law Group

Legal Decision-Making can be ordered in three different forms: Joint Legal Decision-Making; Joint Legal Decision-Making with one parent having final say; or; Sole legal decision-making. Joint Legal Decision-Making: This means both parents have to make decisions regarding the health, education, welfare and religious decisions together regarding the minor child(ren). Neither parents' rights are superior to that of the other parent.

Legal Decision-Making

Guardianship is the process by which a person (the guardian) receives legal responsibility from the court to make decisions for another person (the ward). The ward is a person who is unable to show the capacity to make decisions, usually due to an intellectual, neurologic or emotional disability. Ideally guardianship decision-making powers are limited as much as is reasonable. The ward should be encouraged to exercise as much advocacy and choice for self as is safe

and possible.

## On Legal Decision-Making

Often, immediate decisions must be made by the attorney based upon what the attorney hears from witnesses, opposing parties and the judge. The attorney also sees—from a legal and tactical viewpoint—what is taking place between the participants in the case—including the judge—and must react immediately and appropriately.

## Litigation Decisions - When the Attorney Makes the Decision

Like the executive and legislative branches, the judicial system wields power that is not absolute. There remain many checks on its power and limits to its rulings. Judicial decisions are also affected by various internal and external factors, including legal, personal, ideological, and political influences.

Work towards a decision by consensus. Again, do not try to control or push for a certain outcome, but make sure all facts and opinions are presented and fully discussed. Be aware of your parent's possible feelings of embarrassment, shame and impotence as more decisions are made for them.

The law recognizes that adults—in most states, people age 18 and older—have the right to manage their own affairs and conduct personal business, including the right to make health care decisions. Emancipated minors are people below the age of adulthood (usually 18) who are also considered legally capable.

## Capacity to Make Health Care Decisions - Fundamentals ...

Patients are involved in decisions about care, treatment, and services provided. A surrogate decision-maker, as allowed by law, is identified when a patient cannot make decisions about his or her care, treatment, or service. The legally responsible representative approves care, treatment, and service decisions.

Medical Power of Attorney (POA) Another document that is included in an Advance Directive is the Medical Power of Attorney (POA). Just as a Power of Attorney (POA) can make legal decisions and financial decisions for a person, a Medical POA can make medical decisions for a person should they become incapacitated.
