Rent due dates vary and although you may expect to pay rent at the start of a month, this is regularly not the case so you'll need to plan your finances around this. A good rule of thumb is that a renter should spend no more than 30% of their monthly income on rent. So, if your monthly rent is \$1,200, you'll want a renter who earns \$4,000 each month. The median household income for today's typical renter is \$37,500 a year, and the monthly median rent is \$1,067.
